Dental examination



What is it?

A dental examination shows how healthy your mouth is. After the examination, you and your dentist can discuss the results and plan the best way to deal with any problems.

What will my dentist do?

As well as looking in your mouth, the dentist will ask you some questions.

These may include the following:

- Why you've come for an examination
- Any problems you'venoticed (such as pain orsensitivity)
- Your general health and any medicines you might be taking (because these can affect your dentalcare)
- Yourdiet(becausesugarysnacksanddrinkscancause tooth decay, and because a balanced diet is important toyourgeneralhealthandresistancetodisease)
- How you clean your teeth (because correct cleaning helps prevent tooth decay and gumdisease)
- Tobacco and alcohol use (because both can harm your mouth as well as your generalhealth)

Some of the questions will depend on what the dentist sees in your mouth.

You should expect your dentist to:

- Look at your face and neck to see that they are healthy
- Feel under yourjaw
- Look inside your mouth, at your tongue, your cheeks and lips, the roof of your mouth and the back of your throat (places where there might be a problem that you can't see orfeel)
- Look at your teeth and gums to see whether they are healthy or whether there are signs of decay, damage or gum disease (for children, your dentist will also look at tooth and jaw development in case orthodontic treatment might be needed now orlater)
- Compare your mouth now with how it was when they last sawyou
- Decide whether they need more information from X-rays, or from plaster models showing how your teeth bitetogether
- Tell you about any treatment you need, explaining the choices and whether there will be anycost.

The examination may take longer if you are seeing a new dentist for the first time.

What are the benefits?

- Regular examinations mean that your dentist can spot problems and correct them early before the treatment becomescomplicated.
- A thorough examination helps you and your dentist look after your mouth and prevent future problems.
 The dentist will explain the options and then you can decide together what will be best foryou.
